# Feedback Analysis Report

## Introduction and Objectives:

Rayat Shikshan Sanstha's, **Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu College, Kolhapur** was established in the year 1961. The college aims at the overall development of the students to become entrepreneurs and professionals in the respective disciplines. Every year a survey was conducted to assess the satisfaction of all the stakeholders (Students, Parents, Alumni, Teachers, and Employers) regarding curriculum of the college. The college is permanently affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and follow curriculum prescribed by university. Receiving positive or negative feedback from these stakeholders is important as both these are crucial in helping monitor and evaluate the provision. Listening to what stakeholder say is a contributing factor to running a successful college or institution.

## Methodology

In every academic year, we ask all the stakeholders to fill a feedback form which is made available on college website. Every year data was collected during the period 1<sup>st</sup> March to 20<sup>th</sup> March. The link of feedback form was made available to all stakeholders on their corresponding Class WhatsApp group and also college website. Filling of feedback is voluntary.

For the academic year 2024-25, there were 1219 registered students at the college. Three hundred ninety one (391) students, 231 parents, 230 alumni 63 teachers and 41 employers responded to the survey. The analysis presented in this report is based on the responses of these stakeholders to the survey.

## Design of Feedback

The responses from the parents are collected on the two-point scale



1. Yes

2. No

The responses from the students, teachers, alumni and employers are collected on the five-point Likert scale.

1. Strongly Agree

2. Agree

3. Neutral

4. Disagree

5. Strongly Disagree

#### **Overall Evaluation**

Feedback was collected and analyzed by Feedback Analysis Committee of the college. Opinion of all stakeholders is obtained about each parameter in percentage.

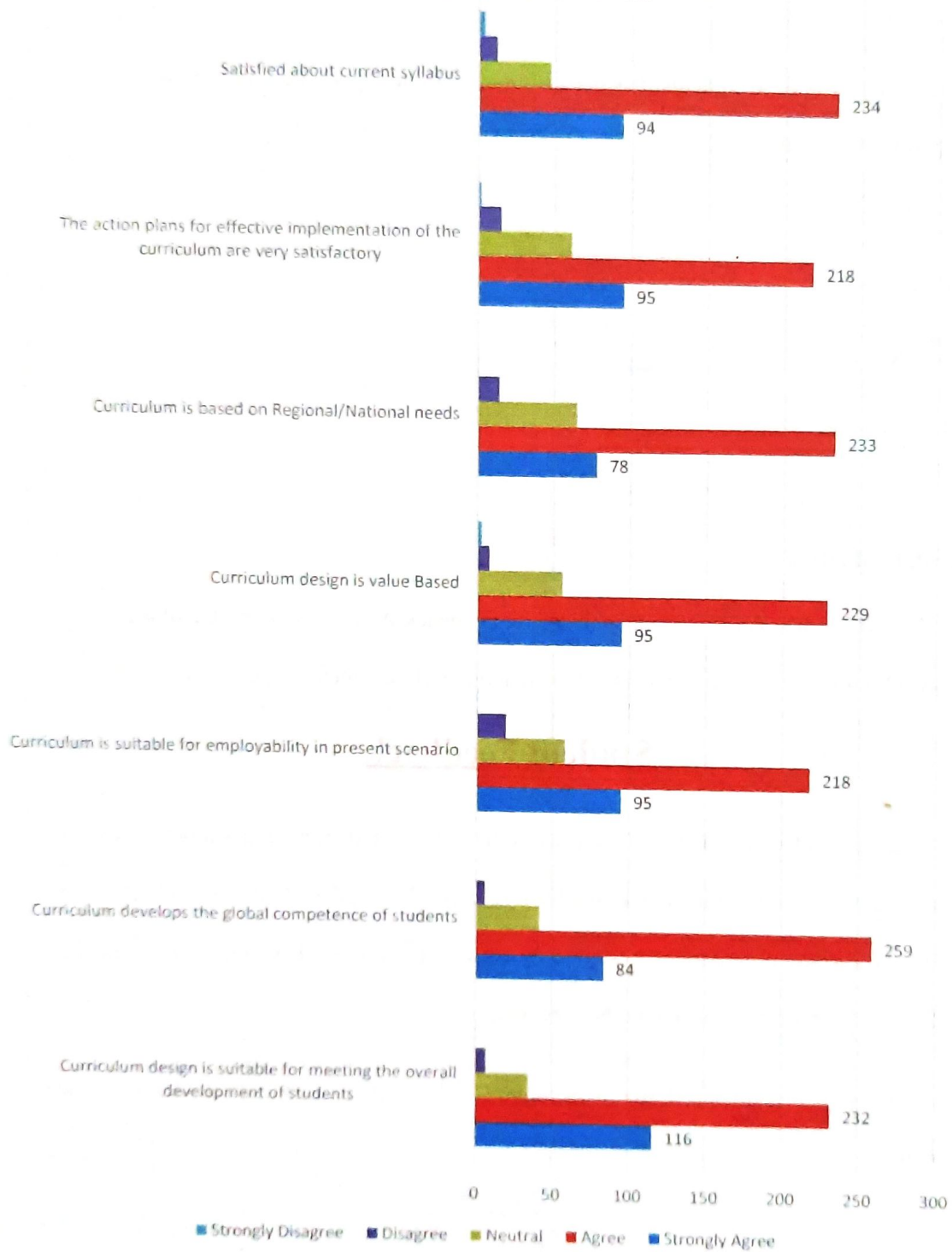
### **Student Feedback**

The respondent sample is broadly representative of the student population with respect to gender, programme level and course. We have received 391 students' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 210 female and 181 male respondents in the survey sample.

Following chart and table shows the summary of the responses given by students for each parameter.

About 29.70 % students strongly agree and 59.30 % agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. More than 66.20% students agree with the

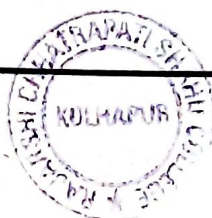


curriculum which develop global competence, whereas 1.5% do not agree with it. About 24.30 % students strongly agree and 55.80 % agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability. But there are less than 1% students who do not agree with it. About 24.30 % students strongly agree and 58.60 % agree with the current syllabus is value-based and is also based on national / regional values. About 24.30 % students are satisfied with the action plan of implementation of curriculum. There are 24 % students who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 59.80 % are satisfied however 1% are not satisfied.

### **Teachers Feedback**

We have received 63 teachers' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 26 males and 37 female respondents in the survey sample. Following table shows the summary of the responses given by teacher for each parameter.

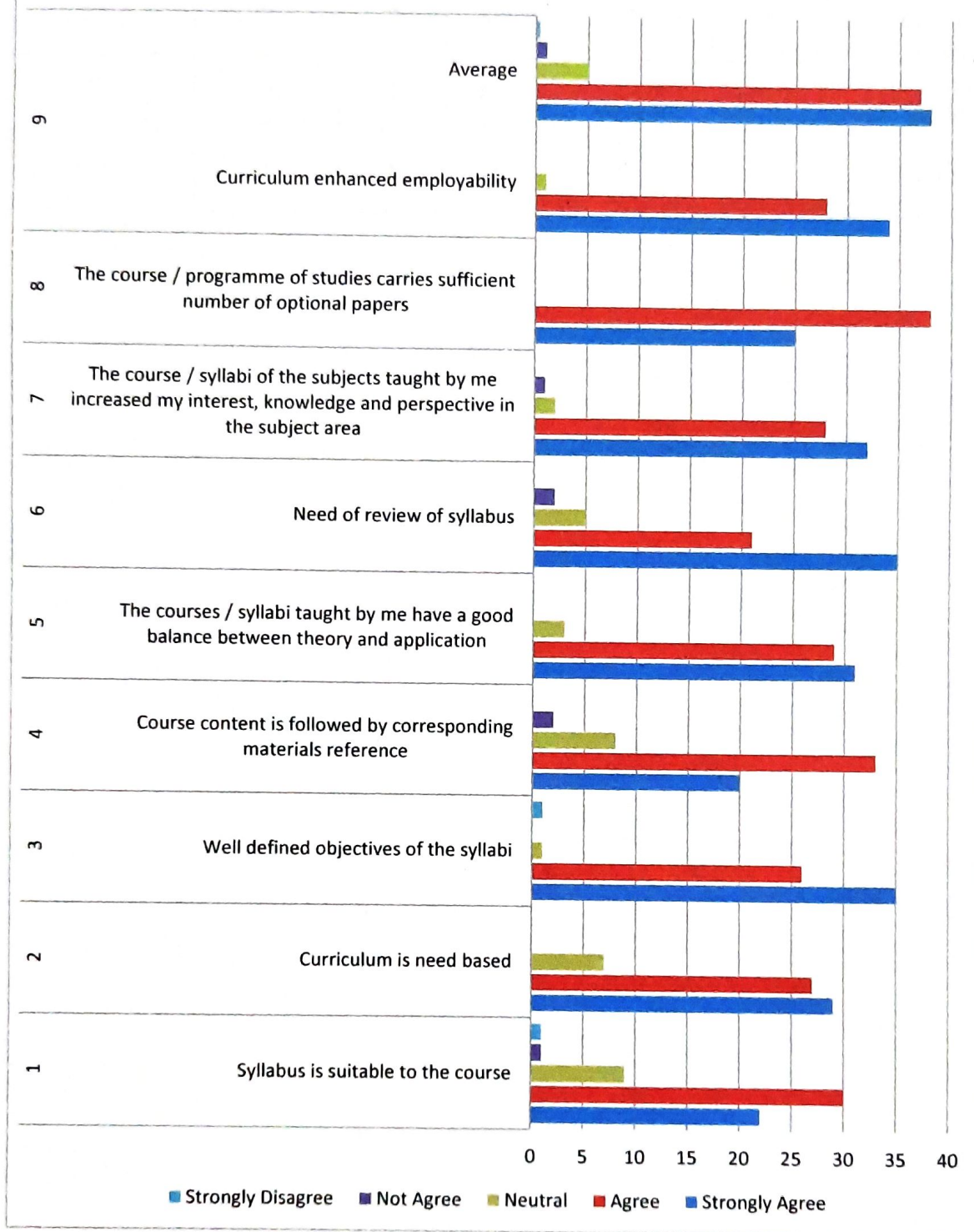

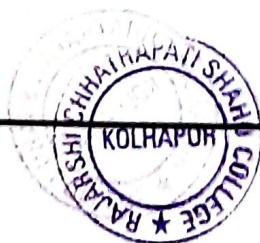




### Teachers Feedback on Curriculum

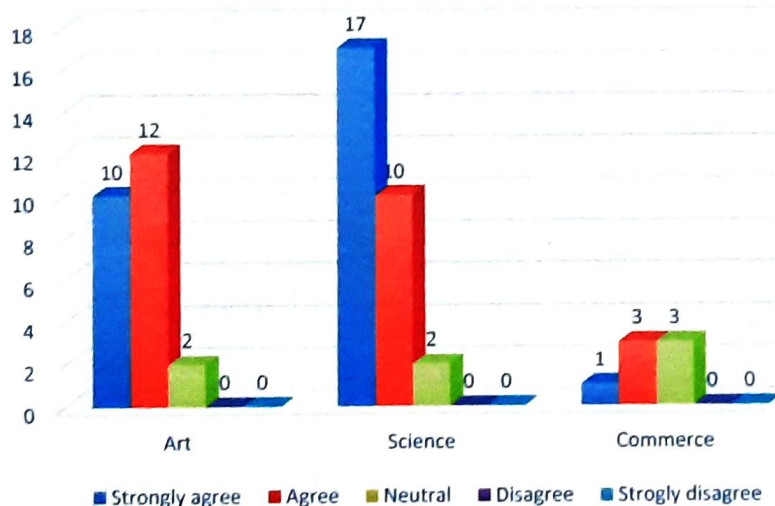


About 73% teachers strongly agree and 17% agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for the course. About 79% teachers strongly agree and 11% agree with the current





syllabus is need based. There are 79% teachers who strongly agree and 14% agree with the objectives of the syllabus. All the teachers agree with the curriculum which follows corresponding reference material. Most of the teachers agree with the syllabus which has appropriate balance between theory and application and it also increases their interest in it. There are lot of people (65% strongly agree, 29% agree) who expect changes in it. There are about 77% strongly agree and 13% agree with the course / programme of studies which carries enough optional papers. There are 76% teachers who strongly agree and 22% agree with the course content which increases interest, knowledge and perspective in the subject area. However, no teachers who do not agree with it



Most of the teachers agree with the current curriculum of the graduation level. There is only 2% of arts, 2% of commerce and 4% from science faculty members who oppose the current syllabus. There are also some teachers (1%, 1%) from arts and science faculty respectively choose to remain neutral.

### **Parents Feedback**

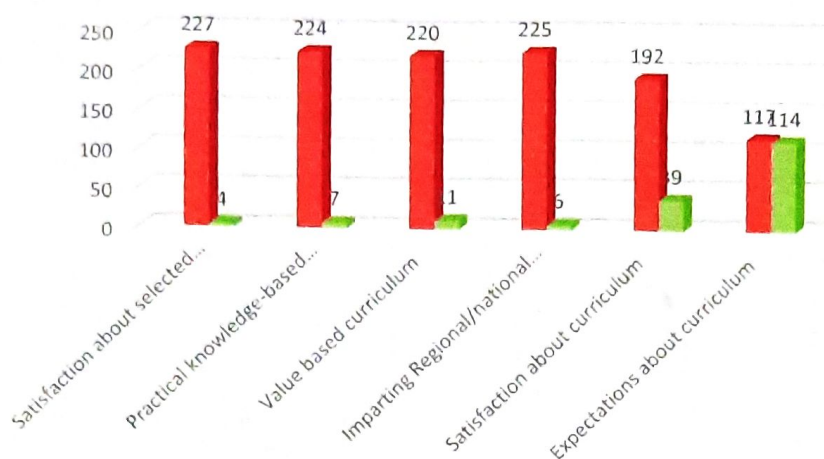

### Parent Feedback on Curriculum

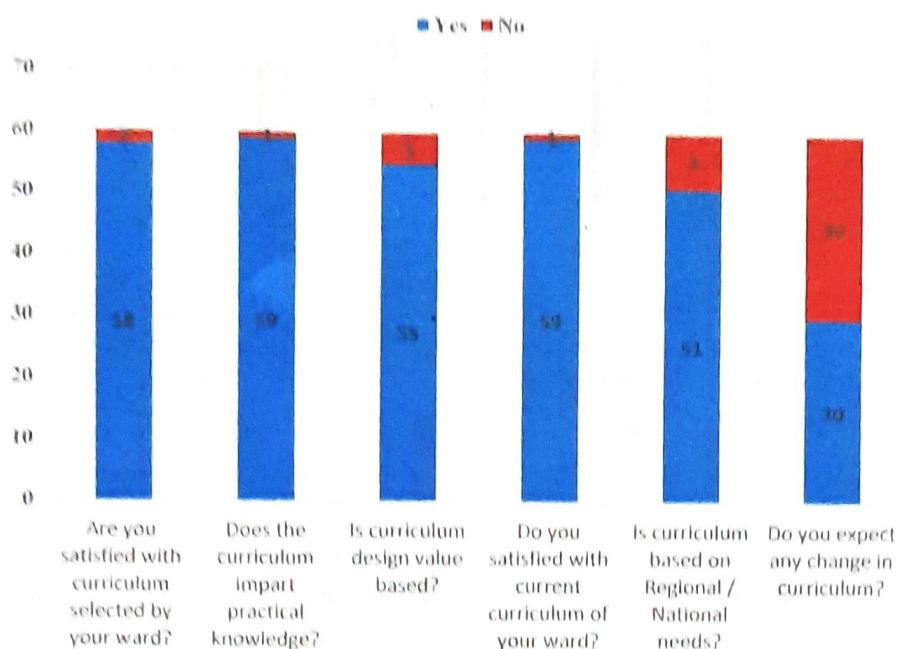


All the parents who participated in this survey are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. There are about 97% parents who agree that curriculum is practical knowledge based and are satisfied with it. 95.2 % parents agree with the point that the curriculum of college is value- based and imparts regional and national needs (97.4 %). All the students are satisfied with the syllabus however, there are about 49.4% parents who expect some changes in curriculum and about 50.6 % has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents have rated excellent for all the points considered here.

## Faculty of Arts

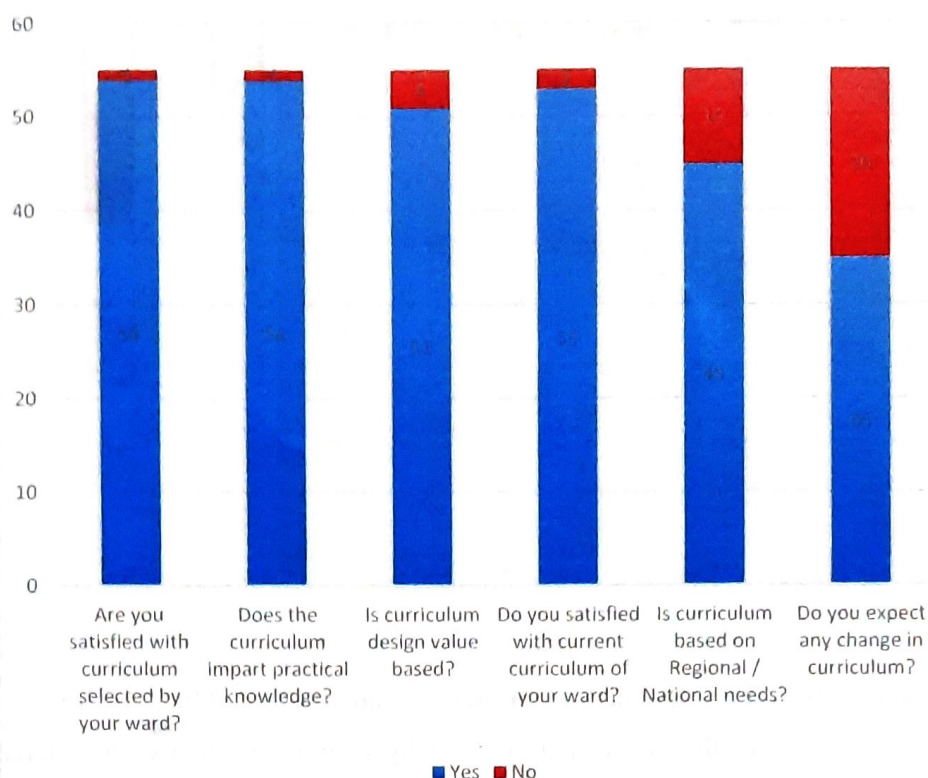


All the parents who participated in this survey and whose children are from arts faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children. They also believe that current syllabus impart practical knowledge (96%). About 95% parents agree with the point that the curriculum of college is value-based and imparts regional and national needs (91%). There are about 62% parents who expect some changes in curriculum and about 43% has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose children are from arts faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.

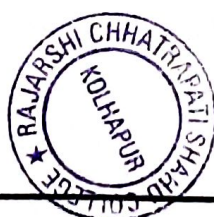


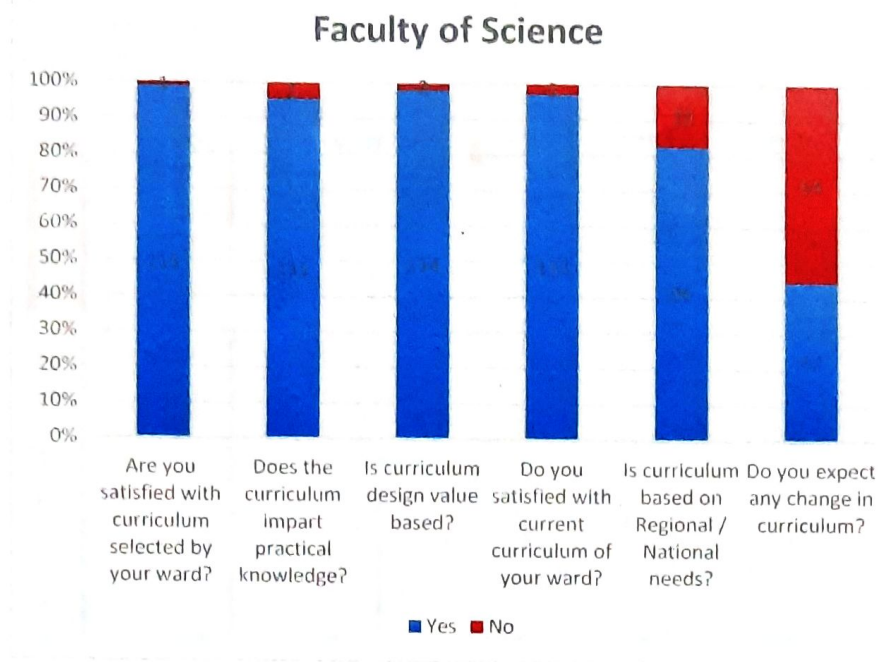


### Faculty of Commerce



All the parents who participated in this survey and whose children are from commerce faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children. There are about 97% parents who agree that curriculum is practical knowledge based and impart regional/national need (93%). All the parents agree with the point that the curriculum of college is value-based. Overall, it seems that majority of the parents whose children are from commerce faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.





All the parents who are responded to this survey and whose children are from science faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their Children and they agree that curriculum is practical knowledge based. They also believe that current syllabus is value-based and is based on Regional/ National needs. There are only 41% parents who expect some changes in curriculum. Overall, it seems that majority of the parents whose children are from science faculty rated excellent for all the points considered here.

The overall feedback from the parent shows that they are satisfied with current curriculum of the college.

## **Alumni Feedback**

We have received 230 alumni online feedbacks on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 100 female and 130 male respondents in the survey sample. Following chart and table shows the summary (in %) of the responses given by alumnus for each parameter.

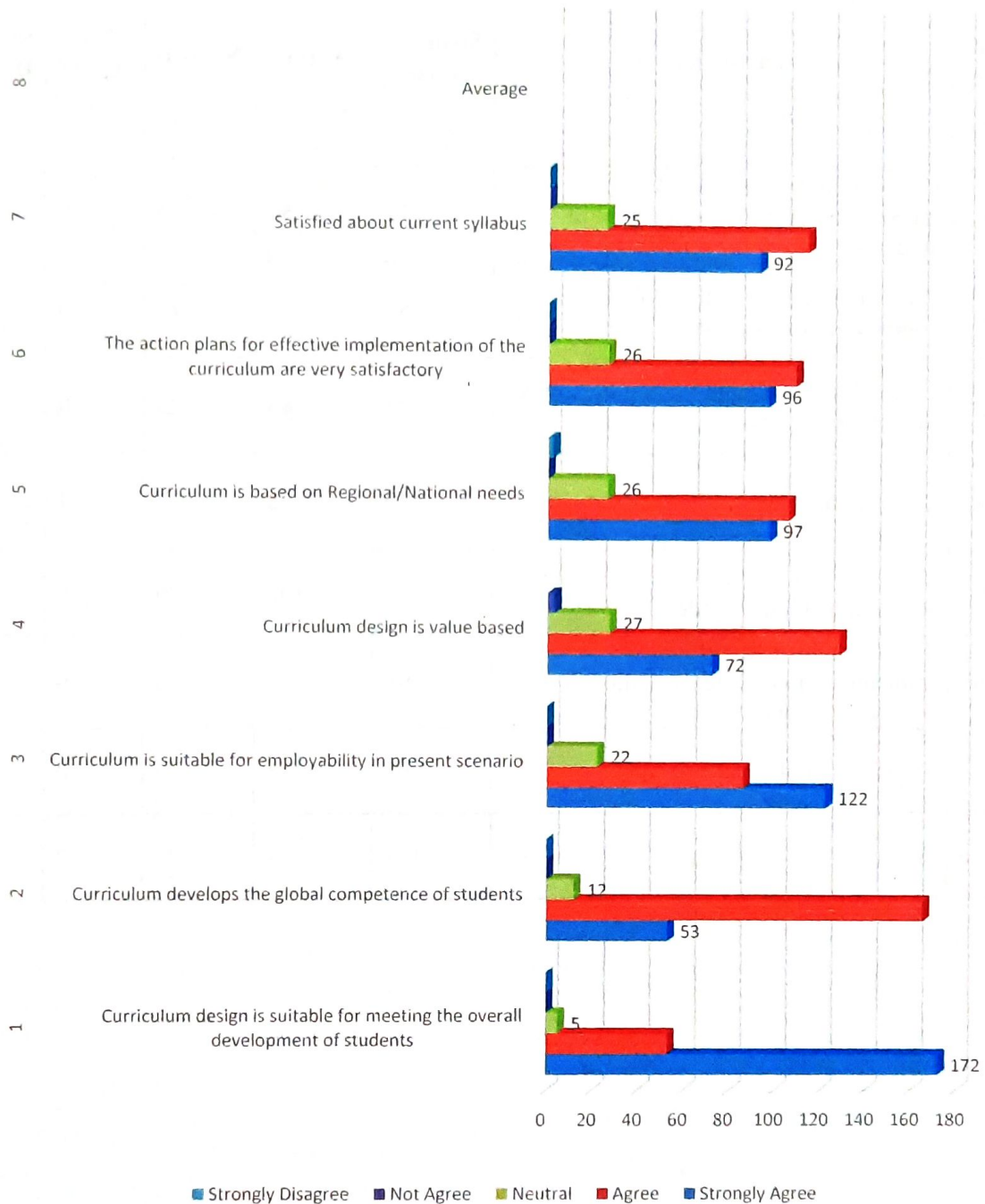

### Alumni Feedback on Curriculum



About 23 % alumni strongly agree and 74.8 % agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. About 23.7 % alumni strongly agree and 71.7 % agree with the curriculum which develops global competence. About 37.4 % alumni strongly





agree and 53 % agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability. About 31.3 % alumni strongly agree and 55.7 % agree with the current syllabus is value-based. About 42.2 % alumni strongly agree and 45.7 % agree with the syllabus which is based on national / regional values, whereas 0.9 % do not agree with it. There are 49.1 % alumni who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 40% are satisfied and 10.9 % choose to remain neutral. There are no alumni who are not satisfied with the current syllabus.

## **Employers Feedback**

We have received 41 employers' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Following chart and table show the summary (in %) of the responses given by employer for each parameter.

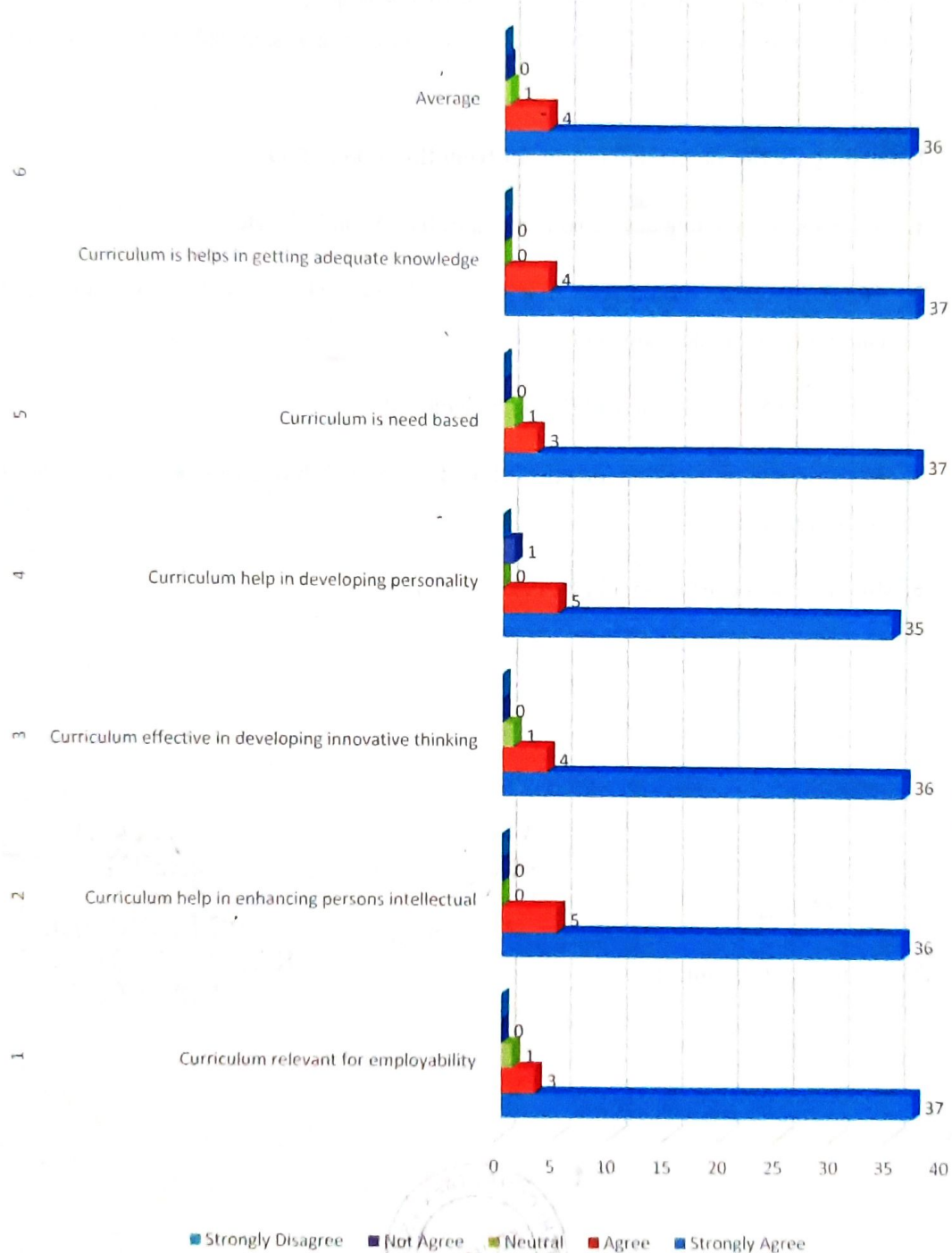

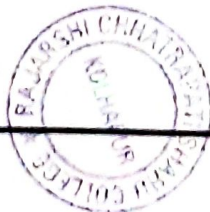

## Employer Feedback about Curriculum




There are about 60% employers strongly agree and 20% agree with the current syllabus which is relevant for employability. About 87.8 % employers strongly agree and 9.8 %



agree with the current syllabus which helps in enhancing person's intellectual and developing their innovative thinking. About 85.4% employers agree with the curriculum which helps in developing personality. Most of the employers agree with the syllabus which is need-based (90.2%). Most of the employers are satisfied with the current syllabus.

**Following are the suggestions received from the stakeholders;**

1. Syllabus may contain advanced techniques like AI and ML etc.
2. More concepts should be added to Syllabus which focuses on skill and entrepreneurship development.
3. In B. Com Syllabus practical should be included.
4. In curriculum most of the practical should conducted through Python and advanced software.
5. More practical courses should be added in curriculum.
