Feedback Analysis Report

Introduction and Objectives:

Rayat Shikshan Sanstha's, **Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu College**, **Kolhapur** was established in the year 1961. The college aims at the overall development of the students to become entrepreneurs and professionals in the respective disciplines. Every year a survey was conducted to assess the satisfaction of all the stakeholders (Students, Parents, Alumni, Teachers, and Employers) regarding curriculum of the college. The college is permanently affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and follow curriculum prescribed by university. Receiving positive or negative feedback from these stakeholders is important as both these are crucial in helping monitor and evaluate the provision. Listening to what stakeholder say is a contributing factor to running a successful college or institution.

Methodology

In every academic year, we ask all the stakeholders to fill a feedback form which is made available on college website. Every year data was collected during the period 1st March to 20th March. The link of feedback form was made available to all stakeholders on their corresponding Class WhatsApp group and college website. Filling of feedback is voluntary.

For the academic year 2017-18, there were 1160 registered students at the college. One hundred and three (120) students, 20 parents, 20 alumni, 30 teachers and 5 employers responded to the survey. The analyses presented in this report are based on the responses of these stakeholders to the survey.

Design of Feedback

The responses from the parents are collected on the two-point scale

- 1) Yes
- 2) No

The responses from the students, teachers, alumni and employers are collected on the five-point Likert scale.

- 1) Strongly Agree
- 2) Agree
- 3) Neutral
- 4) Disagree
- 5) Strongly Disagree


Overall Evaluation

Feedback was collected and analyzed by Feedback Committee of the college. Opinion of all stakeholders are obtained about each parameter in percentage.

• Student Feedback


The respondent sample is broadly representative of the student population with respect to gender, programme level and course. We have received 120 students' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 70 female and 50 male respondents in the survey sample.

Following chart and table shows the summary of the responses given by students for each parameter.



About 89% students strongly agree and 10% agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. More than 92% students agree with the curriculum which develop global competence, whereas 2% do not agree with it. About 87% students strongly agree and 14% agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability. But there are less than 2% students who do not agree with it. About 87% students strongly agree and 10% agree with the current syllabus is value-based and is also based on national / regional values. About 89% students are satisfied with the action plan of implementation of curriculum. There are 92% students who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 5% are satisfied however less than 1% are not satisfied.




Overall feedback for each evaluation point is more than the average value (4.2).



Most of the students (96% arts, 97% commerce, 93% science) strongly agree with the current curriculum of the graduation. There are no students who oppose current syllabus. There are also some students (2% arts and 2% Science) who choose to remain neutral.


Teachers Feedback

We have received 30 teachers' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 15 males and 15 female respondents in the survey sample. Following table shows the summary of the responses given by teacher for each parameter.



About 90% teachers strongly agree and 1% agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for the course. About 83% teachers strongly agree and 17% agree with the current syllabus is need based. There are 73% teachers who strongly agree and 13% agree with the objectives of the syllabus. All the teachers agree with the curriculum which follows corresponding reference material. Most of the teachers agree with the syllabus which has appropriate balance between theory and application and it also increases their interest in it. There are lot of people (62% strongly agree, 27% agree) who expect changes in it. There are about 83% strongly agree and 17% agree with the course / programme of studies which carries sufficient number of optional papers. There are 53% teachers who strongly agree and 40% agree with the course content which increases interest, knowledge and perspective in the subject area. However, no teachers who do not agree with it.



Most of the time overall feedback for evaluation point is more than the average value (4.2)




Most of the teachers agree with the current curriculum of the graduation level. There is only 3% of commerce and 3% from science faculty members who oppose the current syllabus. There are also some teachers (1%, 1%) from arts and commerce faculty respectively choose to remain neutral.

Parent Feedback:


We have received 20 parents online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 25 male and 15 female respondents in the survey sample. Following chart and table show the summary of the responses (in %) given by parent for each parameter.




All the parents who participated in this survey are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. There are about 75% parents who agree that curriculum is practical knowledge based and are satisfied with it. 90% parents agree with the point that the curriculum of college is value-based and imparts regional and national needs (90%). All the students are satisfied with the syllabus however, there are about 88% parents who expect some changes in curriculum and about % has said that it is good. Overall, it seems that majority of the parents have rated excellent for all the points considered here.


• Faculty wise Feedback:



All the parents who participated in this survey and whose children are from arts faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their childrens. They also believe that current syllabus impart practical knowledge (97%). About 93% parents agree with the point that the curriculum of college is value-based and imparts regional and national needs (90%). There are about 60% parents who expect some changes in curriculum and about 40% has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose children are from arts faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.



All the parents who participated in this survey and whose children are from commerce faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their childrens. There are about 98% parents who agree that curriculum is practical knowledge based and impart regional/ national need (92%). All the parents agree with the point that the curriculum of college is value-based. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose children are from commerce faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.




All the parents who are responded to this survey and whose children are from science faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their Childrens and they agree that curriculum is practical knowledge based. They also believe that current syllabus is value-based and is based on Regional/National needs. There are only 40% parents who expect some changes in curriculum. Overall, it seems that majority of the parents whose children are from science faculty rated excellent for all the points considered here.

The overall feedback from the parent shows that they are satisfied with current curriculum of the college.


Alumni Feedback



About 80% alumni strongly agree and 8% agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. About 76% alumni strongly agree and 8% agree with the curriculum which develops global competence. About 84% alumni strongly agree and 4% agree with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability. About 80% alumni strongly agree and 4% agree with the current syllabus is value-based. About 84% alumni strongly agree and 4% agree with the syllabus which is based on national / regional values. There are 80% alumni who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 80% are satisfied and 8% choose to remain neutral. There are no alumni who are not satisfied with the current syllabus.



Overall feedback for each evaluation point is more or less above the average value (4.2) except parameter fifth and seventh.




Most of the students who did their graduation from arts and commerce and science faculty (83%, 60%, 56%) completely agree with the current syllabus adopted by institution, whereas some of the alumnus 10% from commerce faculty and 10% from science faculty do not agree with it.

Employers Feedback

We have received 5 employers' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Following chart and table show the summary (in %) of the responses given by employer for each parameter.

There are about 71% employers strongly agree and 29% agree with the current syllabus which is relevant for employability. About 71% employers strongly agree and 29% agree with the current syllabus which helps in enhancing person's intellectual and developing their innovative thinking. About 57% employers agree with the curriculum which helps in developing personality. Most of the employers agree with the syllabus which is need-based (57%). Most of the employers are satisfied with the current syllabus.

Following are the suggestions received from the stakeholders;

- 1. Arrange workshops regarding revised curriculum.
- 2. Start new professional courses in curriculum to the students.
- 3. Provide PG courses in Chemistry.
- 4. Start skill-oriented courses in curriculum to the girl students.

5. Provide some short term and skill-oriented courses in curriculum.
