S.S. unit has planted 501 plants under the government plantation programme under the title *Ek Laksha, Tera Koti Vrakshain* the campus of the college as well as Shenda Park area Kolhapur.

2. *Banana Plantation:*

The college has Late Sagar Patil International Swimming Tank. Almost 10000 litre water was wasting daily. So the college made a plan to utilize this effluent water. On this water, the college planted an orchard of banana. Now this banana orchard became most attractive point of the college. The true benefit will get from banana after the sale because it is possible for the college to get almost 20000 rupees from this farming. So this is most attractive practice.

3. *Sport Coaching Camps:*

The sport men are not created in a day. Actually we need to train from the primary school, secondary school and then college. Though there are many departments in the college, they have to work to shape the qualities of the sport among the students. So we thought that this is innovative idea to find out the students who are master on the ground and who need the proper guideline in the sport. We carried out summer camps for the secondary schools in the district and more than 400 students participated in Kabbadi and Swimming during his coaching camps. This year we also organized special swimming camp for the girl students of Late Sagar Patil High School, Dhavali. Regular coaching camps for Kabbadi are also conducted. Dr Ramesh Bhendigiri is the International coach for Kabbadi and Shri Nilkanth Akhade is National coach for swimming respectively. They gave the training to these students for

increasing popularity among the students of secondary school to attract to the college. This sport culture helps the college to attract these students to the college.



•Title: Financial Support through Earn & Learn Scheme for Students

•**Objective:** The aim of this practice is to provide the financial support to the meritorious and the needy students.

•**The Context:** The students admitted to the college are from different backgrounds. Students, not capable of paying tuition and other fees due to their financial conditions are required to be supported for continuing their higher education. In view of this, the college and its parent organization have instituted Earn & Learn Scheme for such students. Late Prin.Sumatibai Patil has deposited corpus of Rs.11Lakhs on the college account and the financial assistance given to girls students out of its interest which comes of about 88 thousand. Similarly Hon'ble Sharad Pawar, President of Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Satara has also donated an amount of Rs.1Lakh to the college. The interest of this amount is Rs.8 thousand per year. So the financial assistance is rendered to the needy girl students as well as sport persons out of these interest every year.This financial assistance proves to be helpful to complete there education.

•**The Practice:** At the beginning of every academic year, students apply for admission in this scheme to get financial assistance. At the time of application, they need to submit their academic progress report as well as proof of their family income. Based on the submitted documents, students are shortlisted for interview. A committee appointed by the college conducts interviews of these students and a list of students eligible for financial assistance is displayed.
